Enclosed are the results of our recent survey of Alliance for Community College Innovation members about e-mail communications management. This survey is a follow-up and extension of the February 1997 CEO Survey, What Do CEOs Want to Know About . . . Presidential Computer Use?"

Most presidents spend approximately 1-10 hours per week reading and responding to email and use e-mail as the 2<sup>nd</sup> most frequent mode of business related communication. While 91% of presidents found e-mail to increase efficiency of communication at their institution, over 50% of presidents found workloads to increase as well. Furthermore, 54% of presidents do not use organizing systems for managing their e-mail.
